

## National Classification Process- new applicants Visual impairments

- Visually impaired athletes must obtain an eligible classification grade from British Blind Sport (BBS) and have a confirmed medical diagnosis which is the cause of the visual impairment.
- Contact BBS via there <u>website</u> to go through their application process.
- Once you have received your BBS certificate, check if you have been allocated a classification grade which is eligible for conversation into a para equestrian grade.
- If your BBS grade is eligible for conversion, send your BBS classification certificate and medical evidence of the confirmed diagnosis which has caused the vision impairment to the Felicity Towers (BEF Classification Coordinator).
- Your BBS grade will then be converted into a para equestrian grade.
