Stage 1- Registration

1. Read British Equestrian (BEF) National para classification rules and check your eligibility.

Think you're eligible?

2. Complete and return the <u>National classification registration form</u> and <u>consent form</u> to <u>Emma Bayliss</u> at BEF.

Registration form must be completed in full and medical evidence supplied for your application to be assessed.

- 3. Completed forms are assessed by one of BEF's National Classification Working Groups.
- 4. Athletes will be contacted by BEF via email with results of the application, this can take a minimum of six weeks.

Stage 2- Athlete Evaluation

- Those eligible for an Athlete Evaluation can book an appointment at the of the Classification Hubs held throughout the UK.
- 2. BEF will contact you via email to confirm the results of your Athlete Evaluation.

It can take a minimum of three weeks to receive your results, depending on the nature of your application.

Once you've received your grade, you can start competing in affiliated events.



If you're ineligible for classification, there are many options to continue progressing within your chosen discipline with:

- British Dressage
- British Carriagedriving
